



VERNACULAR ARCHITECTURE.




As this imaginary bird circles lower over the villa, the views become more detailed. The layout of the outdoor rooms and interconnecting walkways, stairways and pergolas becomes apparent. Many of the important elements of the traditional finca: arches, courtyards, columns and cubes, are evident throughout.

Living in Can Belleó is intended to be a sensory experience. The vista from every angle of the villa has been carefully planned so the view from every window, door, terrace or outdoor room is beautiful. Water features on terraces and in courtyards add to the relaxing vibe. Luxurious additions, such as a spa, gym and outdoor cinema, are all designed to enhance the building and blend with the surroundings, while incorporating natural elements as much as possible. With over 300 sunny days a year, outdoor living is an essential part of life on Ibiza. The villa has numerous outdoor rooms where you can dine, relax, watch movies or just chill. On the rare occasions rain stops play, there are covered seating areas. The indoor living space has been designed with full width windows to invite the outside in.

The interior of Can Belleó has spectacular stone vaulted ceilings, an Essentis signature feature. Created by expert Italian stonemasons, these are a unique addition to this fincainspired villa.

Green technology is a fundamental part of the build, ensuring the villa has as small an impact as possible on the environment.



## THE INSPIRATION FOR CAN BELLEÓ

Can Belleó is a contemporary design which uses as its starting point Mediterranean architecture, in particular the simple, functional traditional finca buildings used by Ibizans for hundreds of years.



## **ISLAND DWELLERS**

are a special breed of people, resilient and resourceful with a very strong connection to the earth and to nature. They are especially aware of the seasons and the weather. All this greatly influences how they built their homes.

Ibizan houses
traditionally had thick
walls to retain heat in
winter and keep the
rooms cool in summer.
The windows, which
had no glass, were small
to keep out heat and
light. The houses were
painted with white lime
to reflect the sun and
the roofs were flat with a
slight slope and covered
with juniper sabinas to
collect rainwater.

They used the materials they had around them. Foundations were made from bedrock, local stone was used for walls and clay for plaster. A mixture of ash and seaweed became insulation, while juniper wood was turned into beams for the ceilings.

Traditional Ibizan rural architecture was based around one rectangular hall - the porxo. This had an entrance, usually facing south, on one of the longer walls. Cube-shaped rooms were then added to the other three sides of the porxo as required. Arches, columns and courtyards were frequently used to mark the transition from the outside to the inside.

Around the main house, the farmland was divided into fields delineated by dry stone walls and terraces.

These influences can be seen in the dry stone walling in the villas terraces and gardens.


























Essentis totally reinvented the concept, taking the very best aspects of the old stone masserie – star and barrel vaulted ceilings, carved pediments, arched entrances and walled courtyards - and then letting inspiration, creativity and craftsmanship do the rest.

The Essentis modern masseria villas are strongly geometric, with soaring interiors capped by spectacular vaults which are cut and pieced together so precisely by artisan stonemasons that no mortar is needed.

The courtyard idea has been extended and multiplied over different levels. There are twenty-first century features such as geothermal heating, spas, wine cellars, outdoor cinemas, au pair or caretaker accommodation, indoor and outdoor swimming pools and gyms.

As much attention is paid to the interior design and the landscaping of the grounds as to the masseria construction. Everything and everyone must work together to achieve the same objective: a sublimely beautiful building which enhances its surroundings and is a joy to live in.






#### /FRANCESCO CARLUCCI

is the visionary CEO of Essentis. Over the years he has pushed the limits of masseria design, sending increasingly exacting briefs to his team of architects.

He was the driving force behind creating the first Stonemasons' Academy in southern Italy, with the objective of keeping alive a dying skill and providing jobs for a new generation of local craftsmen.

Now Francesco has fallen in love with Ibiza. And all the experience, skill and talent of the past 14 years is being focussed on creating the most incredible villa the island has ever seen.



Named after his young son Leo, Can Belleó is inspired by a mix of local traditional architecture and the Italian masseria villas Essentis has already built. In other words, a finca with a twist. And it will feature the Essentis signature stone-vaulted ceilings, hand crafted by a team of Italian stonemasons.

To him, this is not just a building project on an island he loves, but a way of turning dreams into reality, passion into action.

these buildings were in their prime, the main priority of the masseria layout was to keep its occupants safe. Just like a castle with its moat and drawbridge, the outer masseria walls presented a strong and seemingly impenetrable barrier with just one way in. Meanwhile the living area faced inwards overlooking a central courtyard.

The modern masseria design follows this concept, creating a physically secure property. In addition, the effect of living inside a walled courtyard with a single entrance gives a psychological feeling of safety. Yet the windows overlook olive groves and nature is never far away, so the walled space never feels oppressive. As well as including the most

beautiful details from the traditional buildings – columns, arches, cloisters and vaulted ceilings - these modern masseria designs play with space, levels, texture and vistas.

Every angle is considered, every detail arranged to create maximum visual impact.

The buildings must also have exceptional functionality and comfort, while retaining simplicity, harmony and a natural feel.







The art of shaping and assembling stone in this particular way is a centuries-old technique. The artisan stonemasons who create them have had many years of training and practice, as had their fathers, grandfathers and great grandfathers before them.
